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### About this review

Since 1996, Moreland City Council has provided a variety of community grants to support community projects and initiatives that facilitate well-being and strengthen the community through networks and partnerships. These grants have a wide-reaching impact and are highly valued within the community. They provide community groups, organisations and individuals with financial support to implement community-led initiatives that benefit the Moreland community.

The Community Grants Program (the Program) is being reviewed to make sure it meets changing community needs and aligns with the newly adopted Council Plan. It will continue to provide close to \$800,000 to projects across Moreland.

This paper summarises findings from the first stages of the project and outlines the proposed changes Council will make to the Community Grants Program.



# Changes Council will make

Council aims to make changes to the Community Grants Program based on the feedback received from the community as well as Council staff.

Whilst some changes can be implemented immediately, others will take more time and resources to achieve.

#### Proposed changes to the Program:

- The Program Objectives will be changed to be the same as the Council Plan Objectives.
- Funding categories will be reduced from 10 to 5, to reduce confusing around which funding stream to apply to.
- Funding Priorities will be reviewed annually to meet changing community needs, such as responding to COVID-19.
- Assessment criteria will be simplified.
- Organisations will be able to apply for more than one grant a year, as long as there are different outcomes for different stakeholders.
- Community representatives will help to assess applications.

#### Changes to the application and acquittal process:

- We will provide more help for unincorporated organisations to get auspiced.
- We will provide more help to all applicants and have a central contact point for all questions.
- You will only need to provide quotes for items costing more than \$1,000.
- We will simplify the language in application and acquittal forms, reduce the number of questions we ask and make it easier to apply and acquit.
